II. Michelle Nestor's Report

• Michelle is the Chair for the PTO President Committee. She also Charis the Inclusive Advisory Committee. They meet every second Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm at the District Office to discuss ideas and work on ways to address concerns and issues in the schools. If you are

- The official Ribbon Cutting at Mountainview Middle School will take place on October 20th at 2 pm. Families and students will have an opportunity to tour the building at that time as well.
- The Eagles Foundation Touch of the Valley is scheduled for November 2, 2019. This year's theme is the 50s.

III. Dr. Christopher:

- Dr. Christopher discussed the fact CV is one of the fastest growing school districts by percentage and number. This year we have about 9400 kids.
- Dr. Christopher discussed the need to address intolerance and harassment, especially at the high school level. Dr. Christopher sees this as an opportunity to prepare kids for success in a global economy.
- Questions were asked about the issue with class sizes. Dr. Christopher discussed the challenges right now given the new elementary and middle school buildings as well as the growing housing in the area. Dr. Christopher did explain the expense to educate four students in a year is about \$60K. Dr. Christopher did state it will probably be several years before the classroom sizes decrease.
- Dr. Christopher talked about Mountainview and the three current teams. Mountainview did not open at capacity and if needed a fourth team could be set up at the school.
- A demographic study will be coming out the end of October/November to address capacity numbers.
- School climate survey will be coming out for families and school staff to address the harassing/bullying issue. Dr. Christopher wants to empower the students to report the issues that they are seeing. Support and report training will be done across the board. The Department of Justice is coming into the high school in December to work on this as well. Once we have the survey results they will go to the Principals with the results to determine what issues they need to address within their schools. The survey is school specific, so it will help focus things in the school too.

IV. Principal's Report

- Support and Report focuses on when you should tell an adult what is going on. Every student will have training on support and report this month. Kids will get the survey which will help the school determine what issues are being seen and what training needs to take place.
- Morning Meetings for the kids really impressed with what is happening in the classrooms during these 15 minutes. Every classroom is focuses on the Morning Meeting from 9 9:15 am.
- Full School Buddy program/ALS Buddy Program is starting back up.
- There is a lot happening at the school. Fall Festival parties are coming up as well as parent/teacher conferences. Parents are encouraged to visit their child's classroom on November 12th or 13th which is the official parent visit dates. Mrs. Raymer encourages parents to

stop in for the morning meeting time - 9 - 9:15 am – as there is a lot of good interaction and development going on with the students.

Shaull enrollment continues to grow. As of the morning of 10/10/19 the school enrollment was at 564. Mrs. Raymer discussed the AS classes and what happens if we cap out at the school. Each case manager can only have 8 AS students at a time. If we cap out, then a new room has to be set up.
